While researching Glasgow we visited Mandy Tidwell’s Great Scot blog. Her website is a wealth of Outlandish information and she often shares terrific travel tips. Strangely enough, it was Mandy’s special interest in the Gaelic language that led to us discover our Preferred Glasgow Lodgings Area. Below is an excerpt from her 2014 trip.

“After finishing dinner, we headed out into the rain for the Argyll Hotel [on Sauchiehall Street]. What was at the Argyll, you might ask? The Argyll is where an event called An Gealbhan is held every Friday evening. This is an evening dedicated to Gàidhlig song and conversation.

“Hmmm ... now I wonder who we might know from the *Outlander* world that would show up at an event like that? Yep, ... the event is currently being hosted by none other than Àdhamh Ó Broin, Gàidhlig tutor to the stars of *Outlander*. ...

“I absolutely love listening to Àdhamh play and sing. He has such a strong clear voice and is very talented in the songs he writes himself. Another *Outlander* fan was in attendance and was convinced to contribute a song or two as well. ... All in all, much fun was had into the wee hours of the morning. I didn’t get [back to my hotel] until 1:30 am.”

Mandy returned to Scotland a year later, visiting Glasgow again in 2015.

“Dinner complete, we headed just down the street to our final event for the day. And when I say final, I mean I knew we would be there until tomorrow. An Gealbhan never ends early. As we approached the Argyll hotel, a familiar figure came into view. Many hugs and greetings were exchanged with Àdhamh Ó Broin, our host for the evening.”

We admit it. The possibility of being able to meet Àdhamh Ó Broin at Sutherlands Bar in the Argyll Hotel is what first interested us in the hotel and drew our attention to the area. Sadly, when we contacted Àdhamh with questions about the event, we learned that he no longer emcees the Sutherlands' An Gealbhan. Since becoming so Outlandishly popular, Àdhamh's Gaelic language consultancy work prevents him from regularly attending the gatherings.

Later during our research we learned that Sutherlands pub and restaurant no longer exists! (We'll tell you more about that in the Argyll Hotel section.) By then, however, we had fallen in love with the **AREA**.

## Our Preferred Glasgow Lodging Area

**Western Sauchiehall Street** became our preferred Glasgow lodging AREA when we realized that the Argyll Hotel was only a 10 minute walk from the first film site on our Glasgow West End tour—only a 3 minute walk from the last West End tour film site.

Reminder: “Sauchiehall” is pronounced, SOCK-EE-hall (or SUCK-EE-hall).

The western end of Sauchiehall Street is situated midway between Glasgow City Centre and the West End, within the northern section of what once was Finnieston Village. When reviewing lodgings or restaurants in this area you may find them referred to as being in “Finnieston.”

## Results from Our Accommodation Research

Based on TripAdvisor reviews, a few places in our preferred lodging area should be avoided, but most of them sound marvelous. Additionally, a wide Hotel/B&B/Guest House price range is available—even a safe and economical Hostel is nearby.

Each of our accommodation reports begins with a picture of the lodging beside a graphic of its TripAdvisor review ratings.

**BTW:** We have no idea why the number of individual review ratings never matches the total number of TripAdvisor reviews. We’re simply reporting what was published when we captured a ratings screenshot in December of 2018.

We also list the 2018 seasonal rate range for each lodging.

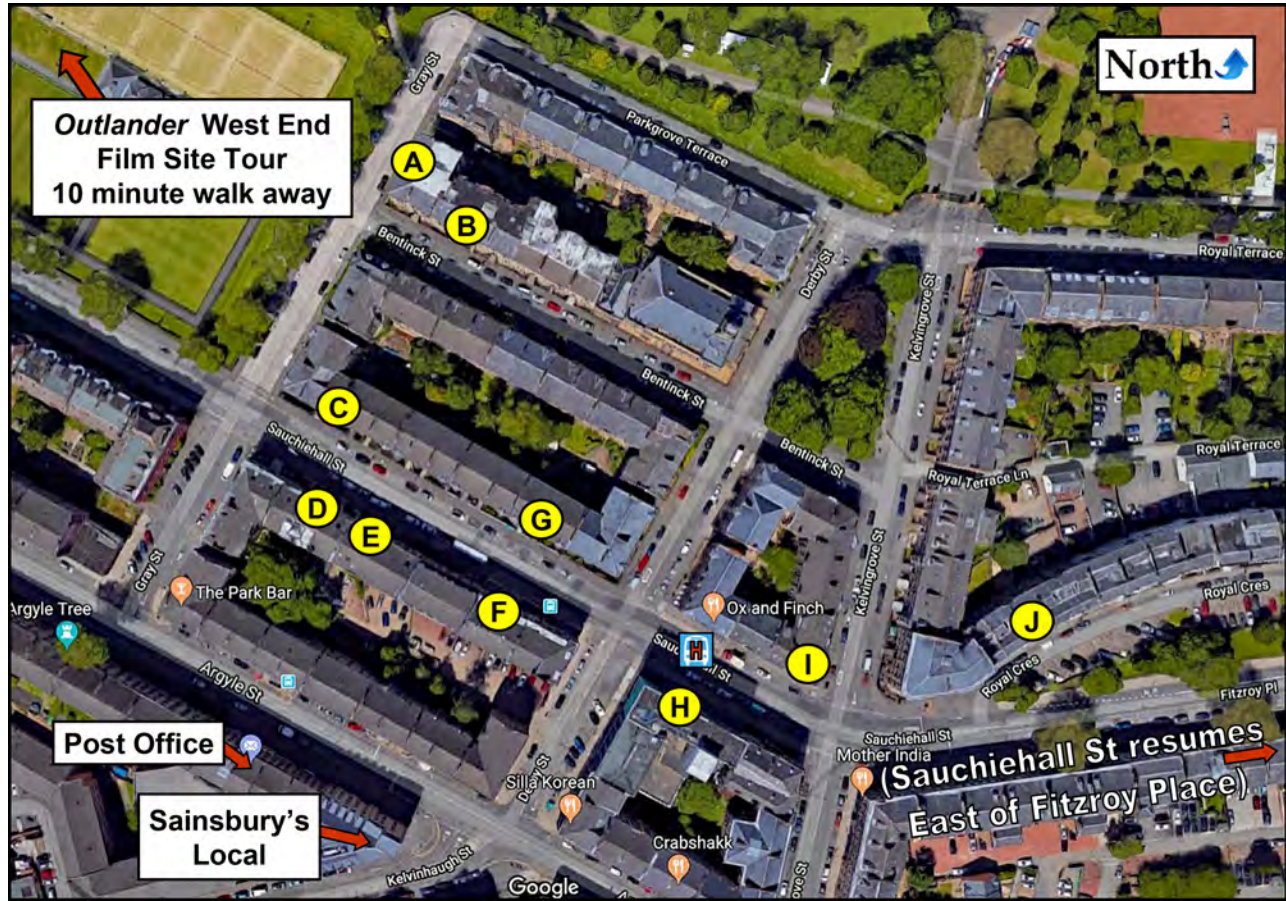
**FYI:** A very popular concert and event venue, the **SSE Hydro**, is only a 10 minute walk away.

Dates corresponding with particularly special performances—such as Rod Stewart or Paul McCartney concerts (GASP!)—may result in any or all of these lodgings becoming fully booked months in advance.

Quoted descriptions at the start of each accommodation’s report are from the lodging’s website, unless otherwise noted.

The map above identifies 10 of the 11 accommodations found within our Preferred Glasgow Lodgings Area, beginning with our favorite, the Alamo Hotel (A). The Glasgow Youth Hostel, (K), is just north of this area and is represented on a different map.

The letter designations above alphabetically correspond with each lodging’s proximity to the Alamo Hotel. This also is the order in which we discuss them.

On the last page of this PDF we provide a list of all 11 lodgings in order of our preference—based on tariff, amenities, and overall value.

### Other Area Plusses

- A “Sainsbury’s Local” — a small version of this major UK grocery store chain—is on Argyle Street, literally just around the corner from all but the Glasgow Youth Hostel. Stop here between 7am and 11pm, on any day of the week, to purchase snacks and drinks for your Glasgow lodgings and tour travel bag at grocery store prices (as opposed to vending machine prices).

- The Sandyford Post Office is only a few doors northwest of the Sainsbury’s Local. In addition to being able to mail postcards here, a 24 hour ATM is available.
- The public bus stop near the intersection of Sauchiehall and Derby streets (in front of the Ox and Finch restaurant) is also an *east-bound Hop-on/off-Bus stop*.

**Please Note:** You’ll need to book a table at Mother India, even on a weeknight.

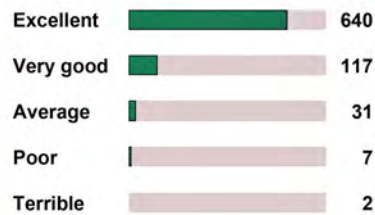
If Mother India is fully booked at the time you wish to eat, the restaurant also offers a take-away menu – perfect for those lodging nearby.

### The Alamo Guest House is our Favorite Glasgow Lodging

Situated one block north of Sauchiehall Street, this lovely, family-run B&B has 10 rooms that offer luxury accommodation at amazingly low prices. Outlanderites traveling solo may consider the tariff a small splurge. For those traveling with a friend and splitting the bill, this lodging is extraordinarily inexpensive.

After purchasing the property in 2005, Emma and Steve Benzie restored and refurbished this elegant Victorian building. The bathroom fixtures they installed are exceptionally modern—some rooms even have “rainfall” showers! Best of all, *every* room in the Alamo Guest House—including the least expensive ones—is sumptuously furnished with gorgeous antiques.



Room 8, Small Standard Double / Room 7, Standard Double / Room 11, En-suite Double

The three least-expensive Alamo Guest House rooms are pictured above. They are small rooms located on the ground level, which is partially below street level and may be called the basement. Room 4—the only room that can accommodate 3 people—is also in the basement. Each of these rooms is amazing. Below is the website’s description of the room pictured above, center.

#### Room 7, Standard Double

Ornate dark oak period antique bed-head, marble-topped 'Bombe' [a French term, meaning “curved”] oak French bedside tables. Lovely cushioned window seat in bay window. 32" wall-mounted Freeview HD LCD Flatscreen TV & DVD Player. Shared [toilet and shower] facilities just outside the door with a sink in the room.

- 1 or 2 people for 2 nights in May of 2019: £148
- 1 or 2 people for 3 nights (required) in August of 2019: £222

The six above-ground rooms have a view of Kelvingrove Park, or the walled garden behind the building. When you consider the many luxurious amenities provided, even the highest-priced Alamo Guest House room is a bargain.

Some of the other items included in Room 12: dressing gowns, blackout drapes or curtains, and an in-room safe.

**Accessibility**

Seven steps lead up to the Alamo Guest House’s front door and there is no lift/elevator in the building. Thus, this lodging is not wheelchair accessible.

Those who find stairs a challenge should request a room on the main floor/reception floor when you call the hotel to book a room. 141 339 2395

**Booking Your Room**

The Alamo Guest House’s online booking system will determine your **minimum length of stay**, based on the day of your arrival—its time of year, and/or day of the week. CD Miller found some aspects of the system slightly confusing, so she obtained clarification from the owner and created the following graphic image.

**First Step**      **Room Selection Steps**      **Final Step**

- First, select your **Arrival Date**. For our example, we selected Sunday, August 18th, 2019.
- After submitting your arrival date the Booking Program will open a new window with an automatically-generated **Departure Date**. This date may be the next day (during low tourist seasons—i.e. late Fall, Winter, or early Spring—and for some mid-week stays in summer

months). *OR*, it will automatically reflect a 2- or 3-night minimum stay, as it did for our August 18th arrival date.

- You can change the departure date to stay *additional* nights, but you cannot change it to stay fewer nights.
- The “1” in the box that looks as if you could select another number will NOT change. It is the number of rooms available that correspond with the room description. As each of the 10 Alamo Guest House rooms has an individual description, there is only 1 of each room available. (Miller initially thought this box was for indicating the number of people staying.)
- Two adults is the maximum occupancy for 9 of the 10 Alamo Guest House rooms. The only exception is Room 4, the “Family En-suite” room, located on the below-street level.

According to the owners:

“Room 4 has capacity for a third person. You can let us know via email or on the booking form ‘special Request’ section if there is a third person in your party. We do not have rooms for 4 [or more] people to stay together (even though we have rooms that are big enough), as this would put too much strain on the facilities of the guest house when we are fully booked—i.e. too many people to be able to accommodate at breakfast (seating, service, etc).”

If there are 4 or more people in your party, you’ll need to book 2 or more rooms.

- After adjusting the departure date, the “Book” price listed for each room is the TOTAL amount of room charge (before taxes) for the entire indicated length of stay—*not* the tariff **per night**.

In the graphic above, Room 1—the “Superior En-suite King” with four poster bed and views of Kelvingrove Park—costs £375 for a 3-night stay in August. That’s £125 per night for one person, or £62.50 per night per person for two people. This is a *bargain* price for a room of that value!

- Scroll down the Room Selection page to see the other rooms available during your indicated length of stay.

We scrolled down to the “Room 8, Small Standard Double” and clicked on the BOOK button for that room.

- After clicking on the BOOK button, the Booking Summary is populated. Our Booking Summary listed the selected room, its total room charge for the indicated length of stay (before taxes), and calculated the DEPOSIT required to book the room.

**The booking deposit is NON-REFUNDABLE.**

If something happens and you later have to cancel your booking, the guidelines for obtaining a full refund of the *remaining* booking expense are detailed on the Alamo Guest House FAQ webpage.

- Lastly: Go to the TripAdvisor page for the Alamo Guest House to check on aggregator booking discounts for the dates of your visit before calling to book your room. If less than the website-listed tariff, quote the aggregator’s rate when calling to book and you’ll likely receive the discounted rate.

**Also explained on the Alamo Guest House FAQ page:**

- Earliest and Latest check-in times. (2pm/8:30pm)
- Earliest luggage drop off time. (10am)
- Checkout times. (10am to 11am, or before 8:30pm the previous night)

This really is a small, family-run, guest house. It is personally operated by the owners, Emma and Steve, with only a handful of other people helping. They all work very hard to make your stay as enjoyable as possible. Please respect their rules so that they can provide an exceptional experience for *everyone* lodging here.

“Just 50 yards from Sauchiehall Street, Beersbridge Lodge Guesthouse overlooks the beautiful grounds of Kelvin Grove Park in central Glasgow.”

**We’re not sure if the Beersbridge Lodge actually has a website.**

The website linked above seems to be more of a booking service. Unless they are outright lying, the service is unaware that the Beersbridge Lodge does *not* overlook Kelvingrove Park, but is down the street from it. There also are many contradictions between the site above and other booking sites, such as Hostelworld and Expedia, among others.

Breakfast isn’t mentioned on Beersbridgelodge.com. Some booking sites say that continental breakfast is included in the room tariff (Hostelworld), some say that there is an extra fee for breakfast (Expedia). TripAdvisor reports “Breakfast Available” at the Beersbridge Lodge, and a recent reviewer mentions paying £2.50 for a “continental breakfast” while staying there.



The “satellite TV channels” amenity cited on Beersbridgelodge.com is specifically contradicted on Hostelworld: “colour TVs (no satellite).”

**Then there are the TERRIBLE TripAdvisor reviews.**

Many 2018 Beersbridge Lodge TripAdvisor reviews are positive. And, if you read ALL of the August, 2018, reviews you’ll learn that a group of disruptive individuals each posted a “Terrible” review that month, in an effort to lower the Beersbridge Lodge guest house rating and drive business away.

That said, several *other* “Poor” and “Terrible” reviews were posted in 2018—so many, in fact, that we cannot ignore them.

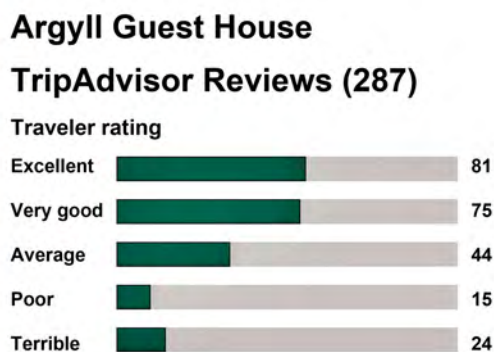

Located on Sauchiehall Street, by Kelvingrove Museum and Art Gallery & Park in the West End, the Argyll Guest House offers ideal accommodation for your stay in Glasgow, Scotland. We are ten minutes walk from the SSE Hydro and five minutes from Glasgow University.

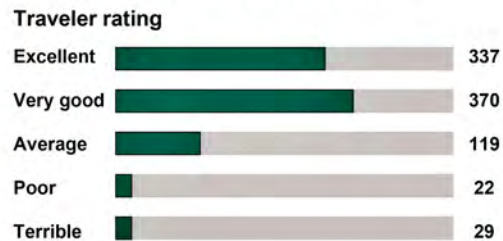

**Great Short Stay (November, 2018)**

“Stayed here Saturday night as a convenient stopover for a concert at the SSE Hydro. The hotel is very well located, only a few minutes walk from the Hydro, with lots of great pubs and restaurants nearby. It’s also ideally located for a walk in the Kelvingrove Park, or a wander in the Kelvingrove Art Gallery, which is well worth a visit. A short walk of about 20 minutes through the architecturally fantastic University will take you up to Byers Road and all of the hip shops and cafes in that area.

The Argyll Hotel’s Sutherlands Restaurant and Pub once served both the Argyll Hotel and the Argyll Guest House. Alas, Sutherlands was closed in the winter of 2018. The space it once occupied was completely refurbished and redecorated, and an all-new restaurant opened in January of 2019; the Soul Food Kitchen.

This is a *vegan* restaurant—not “soul food” as known in the US. Their vision statement: “To make nutritionally balanced, delicious plant based-food more accessible to the people of Glasgow. We also hope to increase overall wellbeing in the community by holding lots of events and workshops in our restaurant.”

The Argyll Hotel & Argyll Guest House Traditional Scottish Breakfast Buffet

Breakfast for those who lodge in the Argyll Hotel and the Argyll Guest House is still served in this space, but it is *not* vegan. It remains the same breakfast frequently complemented on TripAdvisor. The Soul Food Kitchen doesn't begin public service until *after* the Argyll lodgings' breakfast service.

If you prefer a vegan breakfast, however, ask for one. We're sure they'll be happy to substitute.

### **Both of the Argyll lodgings offer Room-Only booking *or* B&B booking.**

The price difference between these options varies from £5 to £7.50, depending on the season. Since no breakfast restaurants are nearby, we suggest springing for the B&B booking.

However! The Argylls' breakfast is served from 7am to 9:30am on weekdays, 7:30am to 9:30am on weekends. If you need to leave earlier than that on one or more days of your stay—or if you'll be breakfasting elsewhere on one or more days—make a room-only booking. On the day(s) you have time to enjoy an Argyll breakfast, purchase a Breakfast Voucher at the Argyll Hotel reception desk for £8.50.

Beverage and snack vending machines are available in both the Argyll Hotel and the Argyll Guest House, 24/7.

Sauchiehall is a busy street, even in the wee hours of the morning. If traffic noise bothers you, request a room away from the street when calling to book a stay in either of the Argylls. (This is a tip applicable to every accommodation found on Sauchiehall Street.)

Additionally, basement level rooms tend to garner the most complaints for both of the Argylls. When calling to book a stay in either of the Argylls, ask to be assigned to a room on the entrance level floor or above.

### Accessibility

The Argyll Hotel has a lift that accesses all floors, including the basement where the restaurant is. The lift is in the reception area, however. To reach the front door and reception area, five shallow steps must be negotiated—as seen in the Argyll Hotel photo above.

### Kelvingrove Hotel Booking Tips

- If traveling solo, the Double or Twin room you book will cost the same as if two adults are staying. If traveling with a friend and splitting the tariff, a Kelvingrove Double or Twin room becomes quite inexpensive.
- If traffic noise will disturb you, request a room away from Sauchiehall Street.

- **Promo Code: "Breakfast"!**

Breakfast is not automatically included in the Kelvingrove Hotel room tariff, and costs £10. While we like the Sandyford Lodge—a sister to the nearby Sandyford Hotel—there are a few caveats that should be considered when booking a room here.

- Despite the lodge’s website description, all rooms are *NOT* “en-suite.” Some have a bathroom or shower that is down the hall—possibly not even on the same floor as your room. While you may be given a key to the so-called-private bathroom/shower, it isn’t an en-suite accommodation.

When booking online, watch for a description of “basic” room, rather than “en-suite” room. Click on the “+ Show room details” button to learn more. That is where you’ll learn that the room is not en-suite.

Note that a discount is *NOT* offered for staying in a basic room.



- As with the Sandyford Hotel, there is no lift in this lovely Victorian building, and the breakfast room is in the basement. If you find stairs challenging, book a room on the same floor as reception. (They may or may not offer to have a breakfast brought up to your room.)
- Rooms on the top floor—referred to by some as the “attic”—have a low ceiling height in areas.
- Because the Sandyford Lodge is on Royal Crescent—a lane that arcs away from Sauchiehall Street—traffic noise is not as large a consideration when lodging here.

The solution to avoiding the above-described difficulties: CALL to book your room: 141 332 9009

- Request an en-suite room on the same floor as reception.
- Request a room away from the street-side of the building.

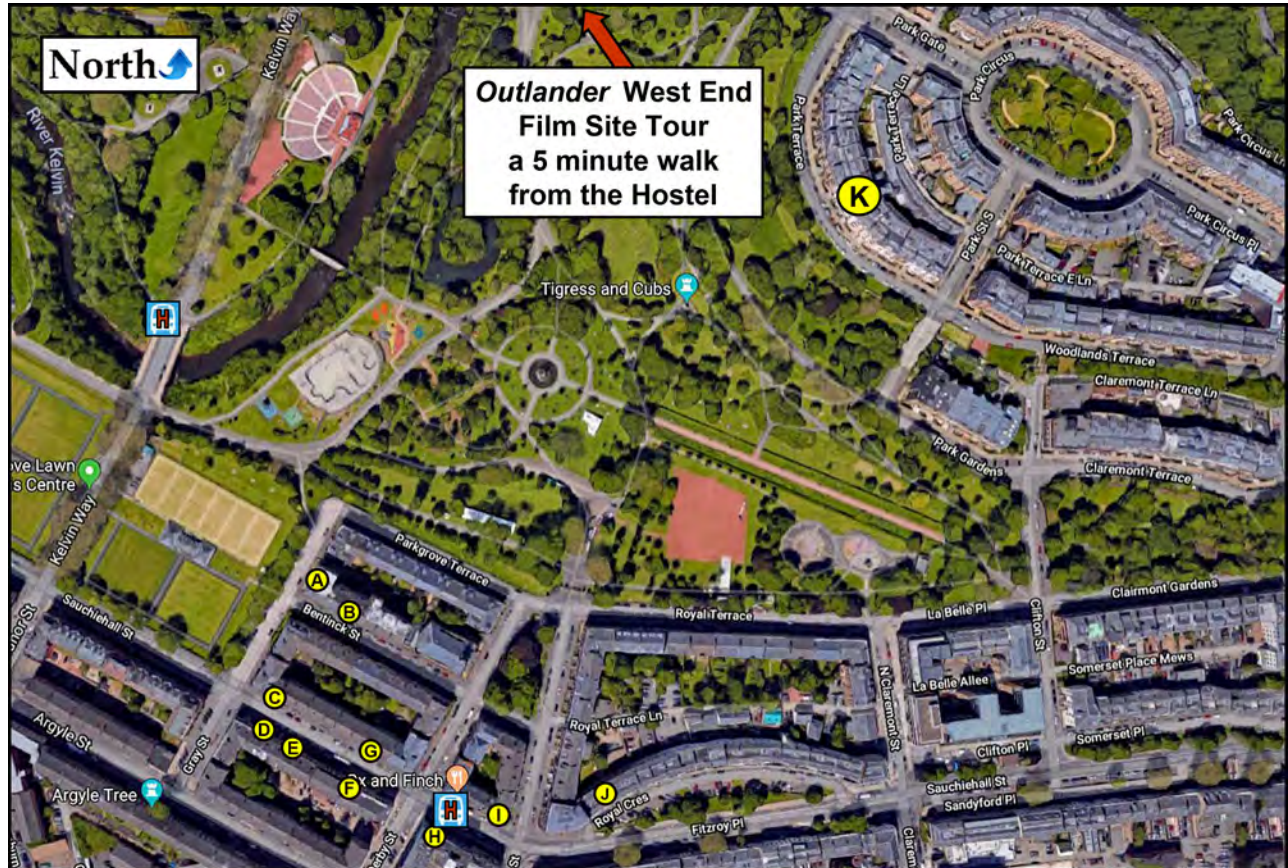

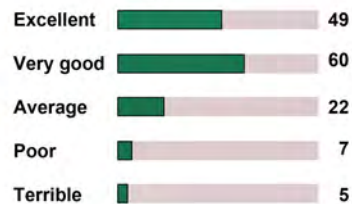

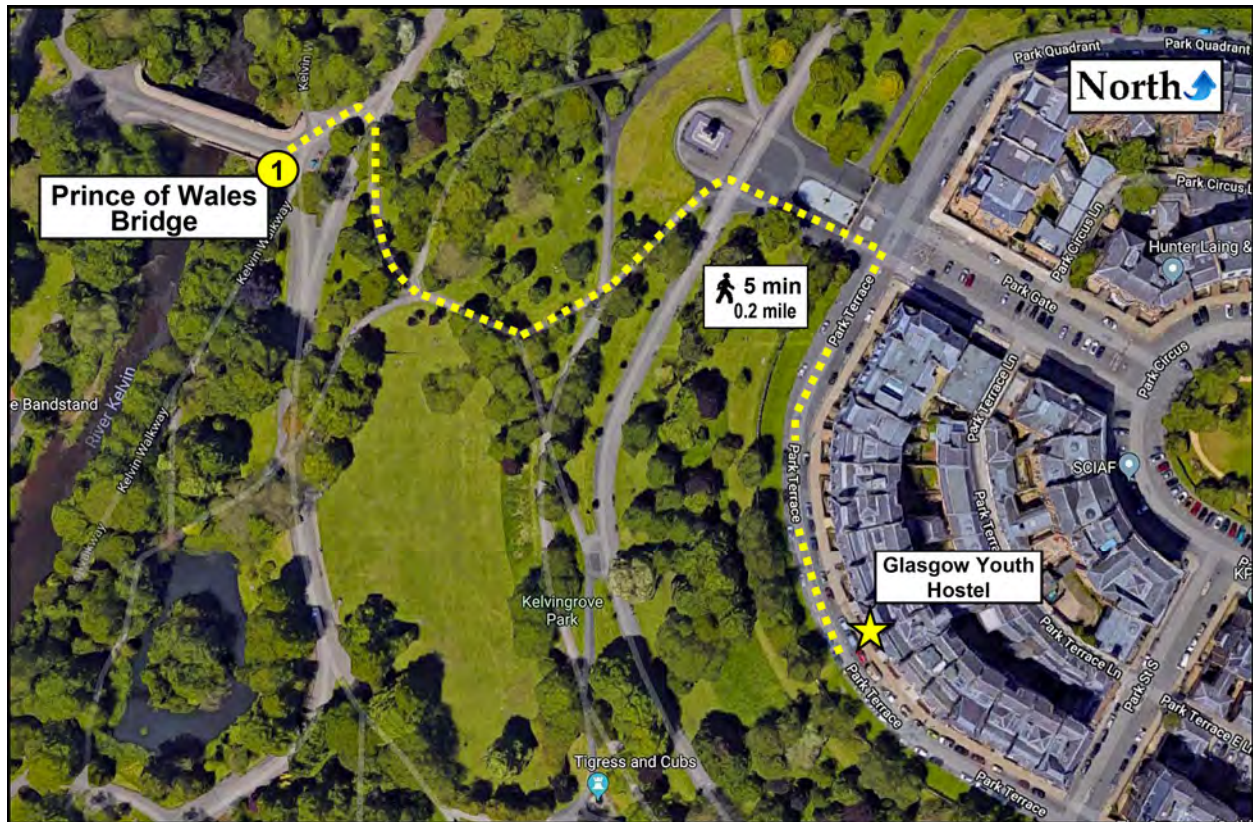

- Step out of the hostel and turn right to follow Park Terrace as it curves north, until you come to a Kelvingrove Park entrance on your left.
- Turn left & enter the park.
- Walk forward to the left side of the Lord Frederick Sleight Roberts monument. (He served in the 1857 Indian Rebellion, and is mounted on his favorite Arab charger “Volonel.”)
- Bear left and walk down the small path that leads southwest from the monument, following it as it crosses a path.
- When you reach the next small path turn right to walk slightly northwest.
- Cross the next path, continuing as your route bears right and curves north, until you reach a major path.
- Bear left and then turn left to reach the Prince of Wales Bridge film site.

When finished at the Prince of Wales Bridge film site, follow directions provided in the Outlandish Glasgow West End Tour (Site #59) chapter to reach the other film sites.

- From the Tigress and Cubs statue, follow the path that leads north to the Lord Frederick Sleigh Roberts monument. (He served in the 1857 Indian Rebellion.)
- Keep bearing right at every opportunity until you reach the Lord Roberts monument.
- At the monument, turn right and walk east to the Kelvingrove Park exit on Park Terrace.
- Turn right and walk south on Park Terrace until you reach the Glasgow Youth Hostel.
