Share Your UK Outlandish Scotland Journey Itinerary with Family and Friends After securing all reservations and solidifying your UK Outlander Trip itinerary, prepare a file to share with family and friends.

Your shared **Outlander Holiday Itinerary** file can be bare-bones-simple, containing only the information vital to communicating with you while you're traveling in the UK. Or, it can include extra info, such as which Outlandish Places you'll be visiting each day, along with their website addresses.

#### VITAL ITINERARY INFO TO SHARE

#### Flight Information

Family and friends tend to worry if they can't track your flights to be sure that your plane arrived safely. Include the airline and flight number for each flight you take when going to and returning from the UK—as well as any flights you'll be aboard while traveling within the UK.

#### Personal Contact Information

#### Your UK Cell Phone Number

If the cell phone number you'll be using while in the UK is different from your normal number, let folks know what it is. If it's *not* different from your regular cell phone number, tell folks that they can reach you at the same number they normally do.

Whether or not your UK cell phone number is different from what folks normally dial, it is important to notify them about the expenses associated with calling—or texting—you while you're in the UK.

#### **Examples:**

- I'm charged only 5 cents to receive a text message, but it costs me 50 cents to send one. Please don't worry when I don't reply to a non-emergency text message. I'll Email you as soon as I get to a place where free WiFi is available.
- Calling my UK cell phone will cost you more than calling a UK land line. Instead, call my hotel/B&B and leave a message. I'll Email you as soon as I'm in for the night and you can call me at the hotel/B&B then.
- My UK phone plan charges me for incoming calls, even when I don't answer them—even if my phone is OFF! **Please only call my cell phone in an emergency.**
- Please do not send me any Emails with attachments. Data roaming charges are very, very expensive while I'm in the UK. Text me if you have something to send. I'll Email you when I have a free WiFi connection and you can Email me the attachment then.

#### **UK Time Zone Information**

Obviously, you'll not want people calling you at 3 am UK time to chit chat! To prevent that from happening, provide family and friends with a link to the World Time Zone map. Additionally, it's a

good idea to assure them that you'll return the favor when **you** call *them*. https://www.worldtimezone.com/

If you think folks might need a simpler, more specific Time Zone reference, consider including lines from the list below in the itinerary you share with those living in the different zones:

#### US and Canadian Time Zones Relative to the UK Time Zone

Atlantic Time Zone = 4 hours behind UK Time. When it is 12 noon here, it is 4 pm in the UK. Eastern Time Zone = 5 hours behind UK Time. When it is 12 noon here, it is 5 pm in the UK. Central Time Zone = 6 hours behind UK Time. When it is 12 noon here, it is 6 pm in the UK. Mountain Time Zone = 7 hours behind UK Time. When it is 12 noon here, it is 7 pm in the UK. Pacific Time Zone = 8 hours behind UK Time. When it is 12 noon here, it is 8 pm in the UK. Alaska Time Zone = 9 hours behind UK Time. When it is 12 noon here, it is 9 pm in the UK. Hawaii Time Zone = 11 hours behind UK Time. When it is 12 noon here, it is 11 pm in the UK.

#### Provide Dialing Instructions for Those who may be Calling a UK Phone Number

Copy and paste the information below into your shared itinerary:

To Call a Number in the UK from a Phone in the US or Canada

Dial 011 (the international access code for the US or Canada)

**Dial 44** (the country code for the UK)

**Dial the UK number**—*skipping* the first zero (0)!

**For Instance:** To reach the US Embassy in London at 020749 99000 when calling from the US, dial 011 - 44 - 207 - 499 - 9000. Ignore the "0" that begins a UK phone number.

#### Include the Web-Based Email Address You'll be Using During Your Trip

This is only important if it's different from the Email address people commonly use to contact you. **BTW:** Before leaving home, be sure that the web-based Email server you'll be using while on holiday is programmed with the Email addresses for everyone you'll want to correspond with. (CD Miller learned this lesson the hard way—ACK!)

#### Provide the Internet Address of Your Outlandish Scotland Journey Blogsite

If you'll be blogging at the end of each day, friends and family will be eager to read what you write and see the photos you post.

#### Provide the Phone Number and Email Address for Each Place You'll be Lodging

Identify the day(s)/date(s) you'll be staying there, as well as the time you anticipate arriving and leaving. It helps to also include your host's name(s), if a B&B.

#### Provide Website Addresses (Links) for the Places You'll be Visiting

This last itinerary entry suggestion isn't vital, but it could be fun!

Since you can Email your itinerary file to all and sundry, providing website links to the places you'll be visiting will allow family and friends to electronically pop to those places on the same day that you'll be physically visiting them. Be sure to identify the day(s)/date(s) you'll be there.
